



How our work affects our families:

When the police engage in undercover sting operations, they seldom arrest the male clients because, as a judge once so eloquently stated, arresting the men would destroy the family, a heavy price to pay for a minor indiscretion.

What about the families of the providers of “indiscretion”? Does it have no impact on our lives when we get arrested? Or don't our children, spouses and parents count?

This drawing was created by the son of a woman arrested for prostitution. It reflects the anger he felt toward the system- not his mother- for subjecting her to the indignity of arrest and incarceration “for her own good.”

“As I was placing the final touches on this picture in the abandoned apartment right above the basement apartment, where my mom and I lived, unbeknownst to me, my mother was being stripped of her rights and dignity. The “Pussy Patrol,” (as they call themselves) had arranged a session for one of their own through an Escort Agency. Gratefully, I did not see my mother being taken away in handcuffs nor did I witness the humiliation she endured, but I did accompany my uncle to the county jail to post her bond. This drawing represents my feelings about the arrest of my mother on charges of prostitution and I have titled it:
